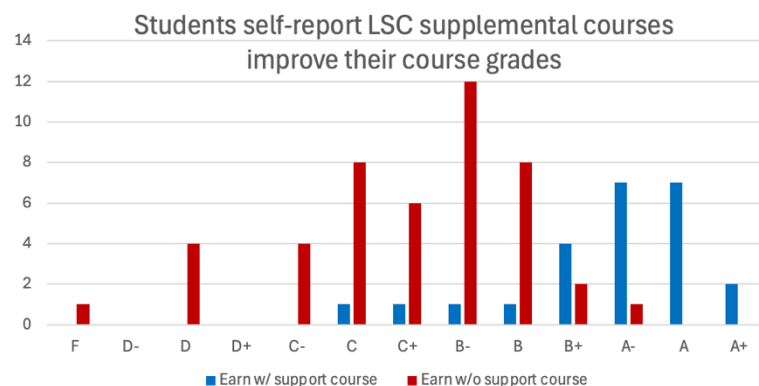

Overview 2023-2024 (Fall 2024)

The LSC helps students foster connections with peers, course material, LSC instructors, and with themselves as learners.

The LSC is **widely used**: in 2023-24 there were over **~21,000 student-visits** to LSC office hours, tutoring, workshops, consultations and support courses. Students self-report that the LSC supplemental courses help them improve their understanding of parent course content, develop study strategies, and improve their overall grade in the parent course.



The LSC supports students across all undergraduate colleges in more than **50 different Cornell classes**.

The LSC has a **strong on-line presence**. From July 2023-June 2024,

- There were almost **370,000** views of our YouTube videos with **11,600 hours** of watch time.
- lsc.cornell.edu had **492,000 users** and **796,639 pageviews**

The **LSC Scholarship** funded **323 students** to help them meet timely graduation goals taking Summer '23 and Winter '24 Session courses.

In 2023-24, **2811** requests came from students looking for **study partners** in **576 unique courses**. LSC made **1459 matches** leading to **618 study groups**.

LSC's growing support for **neurodiverse students** includes consultations, workshops, and community-building opportunities. In Fall 2023, the LSC opened a **sensory room**, which is a place where students who are stressed or overstimulated can find respite or escape sensory overload. It's a welcoming space for all students, especially those who identify as neurodivergent, and it allows them to have greater control over their level of sensory input.
